

Residents Committee Guidelines:

The Residents' Committee, which is designed to be a resource for residents around Lake Roland. The Residents' Committee is composed of residents and neighbors whose property lies in and around Lake Roland. The Committee provides useful information such as contacts for problems such as off-leash dogs, traffic and parking, trash and vandalism. The Committee also will circulate descriptions of invasive and endangered plants, deer management options and water quality programs.

The Lake Roland Nature Council Residents' Committee seeks to promote, preserve and protect the interests of the residents and property owners surrounding Lake Roland. The Committee's aim is to support the efforts of Baltimore County and the Lake Roland Nature Council, in working for the benefit of the park and the residents. The Committee provides a forum for resident feedback to be presented to the Nature Council for consideration. The focus of the committee is to address problems and issues that originate within the boundaries of the park and project into the surrounding community, thereby negatively impacting neighbors of the park. The role of the committee is not to address problems and issues that originate outside the boundaries of the park that either negatively impact the community that surrounds the park or the park itself. The purview for problems and issues that originate outside the boundaries of the park that either negatively impact the community that surrounds the park or the park itself is Baltimore County Government, the partner of the Lake Roland Nature Council in the operation of Lake Roland.
